Chris Robinson, Assistant Superintendent of Athletics



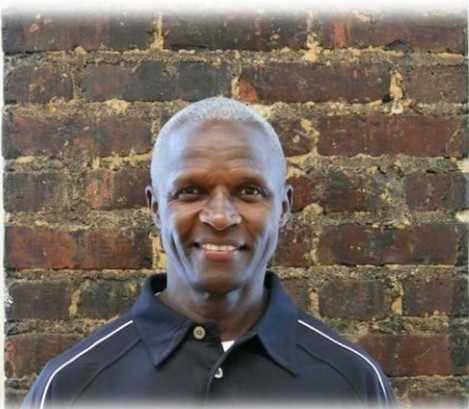
Programs Responsible For:

In 1976, he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Recreation. In 1992 he was inducted in to the West Georgia College Braves Athletic Hall of Fame and in 2007; Carrollton High School inducted him into the Athletic Hall of Fame as a special category inductee. Larry and his wife Belinda have raised a son, two daughters, and a niece. In May of 2011, Larry completed 27 years of service for the City of Carrollton.
